Paradise Lost —Your Help is Requested!

To: All MNA Disaster Response Friends

The Camp Fire started at sunrise on Thursday, November 8, at Butte County California. Shortly after the fire erupted, the Butte County Sheriff's Office ordered the evacuation of Paradise, a community served by the Presbyterian Church in America (PCA). Due to the speed of the fire, many residents were unable to evacuate before the fire arrived. The fire spread so rapidly that firefighters stopped attempting to control the flames, and instead were in rescue mode to help people get out alive. By the morning of November 10, approximately 7,000 structures had been destroyed by the 115,000-acre fire, and at least 42 people have perished making it the single deadliest fire in California history.

MNA Disaster Response is working with Ridge Presbyterian Church, a lovely multi-site congregation with preaching points in Paradise and Chico. The church physical plant in Paradise was incinerated along with every member's home. This is perhaps the largest loss of PCA owned homes in our denominational history, and likely the most traumatic disaster event that has ever affected one of our congregations. Fortunately, our church family living in Chico and other places whose homes were spared have taken in families who lost their homes.

How can you help?

Please pray for our Ridge PCA church family as they serve one another during this difficult time.

- As for the foreseeable future no volunteer mobilization is anticipated. 85% of the community is burned to the ground. Critical infrastructure is non-existent, and only those highly specialized agencies working in recovery are being allowed into Paradise.
